

- » Chazz was born Calogero Lorenzo Palminteri
- » A quote of his father's, "The saddest thing in life is wasted talent," inspired him to create the play.
- Palminteri portrays 18 characters in the play.
- » In a Today Show interview in 2016, Palminteri said, "One of the main aspects of the play is: 'Is it better to choose love or fear?"
- » Chazz joined the Broadway musical cast for a limited run in May 2018.
- » The actor has voiced roles in several animated films, including Stuart Little and Henry & Me.
- » Chazz was nominated for the 1995 Academy Award of Best Supporting Actor in Bullets Over Broadway.
- » Other notable TV/film roles for Chazz include Special Agent Dave Kujan in *The Usual Suspects*, Primo Sidone in *Analyze This*, and Shorty in *Modern Family*.



SYNOPSIS

A Bronx Tale is a compelling coming-of-age, father and son story, born out of Chazz Palminteri's own childhood. Calogero Anello, a young boy from the Bronx, gets swept up in the world of organized crime and the charms of local mob boss Sonny, despite his working-class father's strong values. As Calogero grows up and is torn between these two father figures, he must decide which path he should follow.



### FROM STAGE TO FILM... TO STAGE AGAIN!

When Chazz Palminteri was 9 years old, he witnessed a local gangster kill a man in front of his apartment building in the Bronx. This formative event became central to his one-man show *A Bronx Tale*, which he wrote after being fired from a job as a bouncer in L.A. in 1988.

Palminteri held out on selling the rights to the movie until he met Robert De Niro, who agreed to let the lesser-known actor write the screenplay and play the role of Sonny.

Bronx-born music and entertainment mogul Tommy Mottola was instrumental in getting the film adapted into a musical. Robert De Niro, who directed the film version, also co-directed the stage musical, for which Palminteri wrote the book.
